### WORKING TOGETHER WITH THE INSPECTORATE



Many people do not understand the complex nature of how the branches and Inspectorate work together. It is a very special relationship that works very well but branches are also the front line for taking any animals that the Inspectors may pick up. These can be strays, animals injured on the roads, cruelty cases where animals are in a dire state, plus possibly large numbers of animals taken in at the same time from a house over-run with, say cats, which has to be cleared. Unlike some charities who can choose what they take in, we cannot. Not only do we not deal in one specific breed but we also take some of the most poorly and ill-treated animals to nurse back to care. We do not have the luxury of choosing which ones we take and which ones we don't. Nor would be want to. For us **EVERY** animal is important.

When an Inspector picks up an animal their first port of call is to a vet. The Society then pays the initial amount required to make the animal comfortable or, in the worst case scenario, put it to sleep. After that the animal is then moved on to the local branch or wildlife centre or Society home. In many cases it is the branch that is the first port of call and wherever possible the branches take the animals. The care, veterinary treatment, food and shelter then becomes the responsibility of the branch. In the case of an injury it can mean possibly a leg has to be amputated or urgent surgery for some other problem. It can just mean love and TLC until a new and loving home is found.

This can all cost a lot of money so you will appreciate that when we constantly get phone calls for help we do our best to accommodate **but it just isn't always possible.** What is becoming increasingly distressing is the **verbal abuse** we receive when we cannot just take in animals at the drop of a hat because people want to get rid of them. Nor do we have a bottomless pit of money. Our duty is to all those animals who DON'T have an owner, who are totally DEPENDENT on the Inspectorate and branches for help. The stress caused to our staff and volunteers by the ever increasing abuse is extremely upsetting, especially as they work so very hard in the name of animal welfare, often working beyond the call of duty to ensure an animal's safety and comfort.

The RSPCA National Society and Branches are taking a lot of stick and abuse from the public at the moment but you can all rest assured that EVERYONE is working exceedingly hard for animals. We are flooded out with the every increasing numbers of unwanted animals. Last year the number of unwanted cats alone rose by 24%!! Your branch currently has 40 kittens and 75 cats in total - way more than we should be dealing with but we do our best to NEVER turn away an animal in need. That goes for the Inspectorate, the Society and all branches so please, if you do hear people criticising us perhaps you could just refer them to this article from your newsletter and tell them that we are **ALL** really are doing the very best we can -



for ALL animals



At the Regional Board Meeting held on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> October at Horsham it was announced that there is to be a **rally at Ramsgate Port on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> November.** Anyone who feels strongly that this awful trade should be abolished is welcome to come along.

Daphne Harris, your Chairman and her daughter Katie have long championed this cause and she will be speaking at the port on the day.



Sadly so far, because this appalling trade is essentially still legal it is difficult to change things but that doesn't mean that the fight to stop it and change the law should not continue. These animals can suffer

appalling injuries, severe distress and even death on these journeys. In the 21<sup>st</sup> century this kind of transport is totally unacceptable and the fight will continue until changes are made. Some progress has been made in that the Inspectorate are now able to intervene if they have cause for concern i.e. if they actually see a sheep's leg hanging out of the lorry or



other signs of distress but even they are limited in what they are allowed to do. We need to bring more attention to this continuing trade **so please**, **if you can**, **spread the word and help campaign against it. Thank you.**
